Hi Roy,

So as you're looking at a new building, you'll get brought into rating upon completion of the build.

In principle, with evidence that a registered charity is in occupation of a property, the 80% relief is applied automatically upon occupation of the property as this is considered a mandatory relief.

Upon being registered at the address, an application form for the discretionary relief would be then be issued. However, further information regarding our discretionary relief policy can be found at the link below.
